

Education is the key to meeting this moment -- our most powerful tool to ignite a thriving Jewish Future.




From Covid Response to Cornerstone of Our Strategic Vision

Born during the pandemic as a digital resource-hub, The Jewish Educator Portal has evolved into a sophisticated virtual ecosystem serving diverse Jewish educational settings.

This expanding platform connects educators across early childhood centers, yeshivas, public schools, Hebrew schools, teen experiences, and summer camps with the tools, content, and professional development they need to excel. The Jewish Educator Portal currently curates and aggregates educational content from nearly 40 trusted content providers ensuring that our educators are receiving the very best resources from across the broad Jewish education ecosystem.

In the twelve months between July 2024 and June 2025, our resources were viewed over 162,000 times by educators and parents, demonstrating its essential role in the Jewish education landscape. Since its launch in late 2020, registered members who are **Portal superusers have grown by more than 650%**. By leveraging advanced technology, we ensure that accurate, compelling Jewish educational content reaches educators wherever and however they teach, strengthening Jewish education across all learning environments.


Portal Registered Members

Jewish Education Team (JET)

Empowering Educators, Enriching Jewish Life in Every Setting

For countless Jewish children across North America, their most formative Jewish experiences happen outside the hours of a traditional school day. In JCCs and synagogues, at summer camps and youth group gatherings, during Sunday morning programs and outdoor adventures, young people discover what it means to be Jewish in today's world.

Our Jewish Education Team recognizes that these community-based programs often serve as the primary gateway to Jewish life for families seeking connection. From weekly Hebrew school classes to immersive camp experiences, this diverse educational ecosystem shapes how an entire generation understands and lives their Judaism.

These are the spaces where children build foundational Jewish knowledge, forge lifelong friendships rooted in shared values, and develop the confidence to carry Jewish traditions into their adult lives. For many families, particularly those outside Orthodox communities, these programs represent their most significant touchpoint with Jewish learning and community.

JET works across the entire spectrum of Jewish educational settings, promoting innovation and elevating practice. JET recognizes that Jewish learning doesn't happen in isolation—it thrives in diverse environments where educators are equipped with excellent content, proven pedagogical approaches, and the tools to make Jewish wisdom relevant for today's learners. By supporting educators and programs across all settings, the Jewish Education Team ensures that every Jewish educational experience, regardless of where it occurs, has the potential to be transformative.

RootOne

Preparing confident Jewish teens for college and beyond

The RootOne team focuses on the critical teen years, harnessing the power of immersive Israel travel experiences to revolutionize how Jewish teens connect with Israel and strengthen their Jewish identities. Seeded by The Marcus Foundation and powered by The Jewish Education Project, this ambitious initiative has already enabled 15,000 teens to experience Israel firsthand.

Together with trip providers, tour operators, third-party evaluators and the most creative minds in teen Israel education, RootOne has redefined how teen Israel travel is envisioned, designed, executed, and facilitated to best prepare teens to enter college as proud, confident, and informed Jews.

RootOne fuels Israel experiences that reflect how teens learn today. By using data, technology, and professional development, RootOne delivers safe, engaging, and authentic Israel experiences that foster a wider understanding of Israel through friendships with Israeli peers, thoughtful exploration, and reflection, establishing foundations for lifelong Jewish identity and engagement.

Yeshiva General Studies

Elevating secular education in Jewish schools

The Yeshiva General Studies team works specifically with yeshivas and day schools to strengthen secular studies within these educational environments. This team focuses on elevating educational quality across all general studies subjects, providing access to professional development and training, and ensuring students receive outstanding secular education that prepares them for academic, professional and civic success.

With over 350 day schools and yeshivas in the greater New York area, the team facilitates access to professional development, serves as a technical consultant for schools accessing government funding, and represents Jewish schools to the New York State Education Department and NYC Department of Education. Their work ensures that students in Jewish schools receive quality secular education that prepares them for academic success while reinforcing their Jewish identity.



Center for Jewish-Inclusive Learning (CJIL)

Where public and independent schools foster understanding and inclusion

The Center for Jewish-Inclusive Learning Team supports educators and educational leaders in public and independent school settings. Established in response to rising antisemitism facing Jewish students since October 7th, CJIL ensures educators and school leaders have access to accurate resources about the Jewish people, Israel, and historic and modern antisemitism, making schools safe and inclusive spaces for Jewish students and faculty.

CJIL's strategic priorities include building relationships with NYC public school district leadership, facilitating professional development for educators and administrators, and distributing high-quality, vetted content about the Jewish people and Israel. While current efforts concentrate on the New York City area, CJIL is positioned to expand this vital work nationally.

Increased the numbers of North American Jewish teens arriving on college campuses prepared to be proud Jews

with a strong connection to Israel following participation in personally transformative and educationally excellent RootOne Israel experiences.

Provided excellent, cutting-edge, timely, and relevant professional development online and in person,

for the broadest diversity of educators of Jewish children and youth in North America.

Furnished educators and educational leaders in public and independent schools

with professional development and resources so that a positive image of Jews and Israel is prevalent across the entire New York educational system.

NEW YORK'S EDUCATIONAL PARTNER

Since 1910, initially as the Bureau (and later the Board) of Jewish Education of Greater New York, The Jewish Education Project has served as New York's central agency for Jewish education and UJA-Federation of New York's primary partner in strengthening Jewish education in the largest and most diverse Jewish community in the country.



This special relationship with New York City, Westchester, and Long Island is central to our strategy, making New York the sandbox where we test new ideas and initiate new projects, while continuously reflecting upon and responding to New York's unique needs.

Relationships are at the heart of our work in New York, providing the foundation for impact. Working across the full spectrum of Jewish educational institutions—from traditional yeshivas and day schools—to progressive synagogue schools, early childhood centers, teen programs, and JCCs, the Jewish Education Project's staff provides direct support to area educators through consultations, networks, in-person workshops, and convenings.

More recently, through our Center for Jewish-Inclusive Learning, we extend our impact beyond Jewish educational spaces into public and independent schools, ensuring that the Jewish people, Israel, and both modern and historic antisemitism are represented fairly and accurately. We help educators move beyond Holocaust-focused curricula to present Judaism as a vibrant, living culture with contemporary relevance, empowering educators in public and independent schools to teach about Jewish life with nuance and authenticity.

Our deep roots in New York enable us to respond to the unique needs of educators, regardless of educational environment. This positions us as an essential bridge between diverse educational worlds, ensuring that Jewish education and representation remains meaningful, accurate, and accessible throughout the region we've proudly served for generations.

Facilitate general studies professional development in alignment with substantial equivalency requirements and yeshiva cultural norms.
